## Dates for your diary

Key dates including class assemblies, enrichment days/events and coffee mornings can be found on our school website calendar or our parent dates letter sent out at the beginning of every half term.

## PE

## Homework

Children in Year 1 should spend a set time each day completing homework and practising spellings to ensure good routine. This should include:

- Completing the weekly literacy and numeracy tasks which will be set on Thursday and is to be returned the following Monday.
- Reading their home reading book for 15 minutes each evening (please sign the diary to show this has been completed).
- Learning their weekly spellings.
- Learning their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.



## Literacy

As writers, we will be reading a range of stories with predictable phrases as inspiration for our own writing. We will also be sequencing ideas and using time connectives when writing a recount.



## Maths

As mathematicians, we will be consolidating our number knowledge by using a variety of concrete resources such as number lines, tens frames and bead strings. We will be counting in steps of two, fives and tens. We will also be investigating 2D and 3D shapes.



## Science

As scientists, we will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We also be investigating diets and finding out if animals are omnivores, herbivores or carnivores.



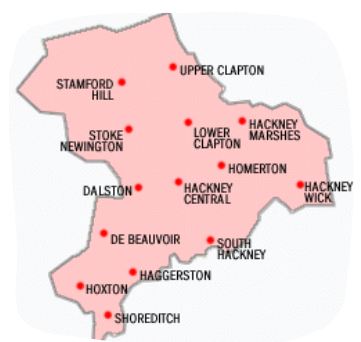

As geographers, we will studying maps in order to locate and navigate places. We will be learning to read maps using symbols and directions. In our lessons we will create our aerial view maps of our classroom, playground and local area.



## Physical Education (PE)

In PE, we will be developing our dance skills. We be focusing on movement through the theme of animals and exploring ways in which our bodies can move to the rhythm and beat of music.
